Sunday, March 10, 2024 **NAMI Contra Costa and** the Angelo Quinto Foundation Remember Angelo Quinto on his 34th Birthday



On Sunday, March 10, at the Antioch Waterpark Multi-Use Hall, the Angelo Quinto Foundation held its annual event honoring Angelo and his legacy on what would have been his 34th birthday. They celebrated the past three years' accomplishments, and introduced their next Call to Action in partnership with NAMI Contra Costa: to separate the sheriff and coroner in Contra Costa County.

The event, sponsored by NAMI Contra Costa, was well attended, with about 80 guests in-person and some attending via Zoom. Flower arrangements, photos, altars, and beautiful food and dessert tables set the tone for a celebratory, commemorative afternoon.

The AQF kicked off the event with a video of Angelo reflecting on his life while on a hike, recorded in December of 2019, then introduced a series of speakers. Antioch's honorary poet laureate, José Cordon, opened the speaking portion with two resonant poems. Keynote speaker Assemblymember Mike Gipson—author of AB 490 (2021): Positional Asphyxia, AB 1608 (2022): Separating Sheriff-Coroners, and AB 360 (2023): Excited Delirium spoke about working with the Quinto-Collins family about the recent passage of AB 360. Another keynote speaker, Joanna Naples-Mitchell from Physicians for Human Rights. who have been instrumental in debunking "excited delirium," described invaluable resources

like PHR's initial report on the term as well as their new interactive site with Campaign Zero, and celebrated the news that the Quinto-Collins family will be receiving a humanitarian award from PHR!

Other speakers included David Hochschild, close family friend of the Quinto-Collins', who has advocated for justice for Angelo since the tragedy of his death occurred; Antioch City Councilmember Monica Wilson, who has contributed to necessary police reform and the establishment of mental health response teams in Antioch; BART Police Oversight members Russell Bloom and Patrick Caceres, who helped get rid of the use of "excited delirium" at BART; NAMI Contra Costa Executive Director Gigi Crowder, who discussed some valuable resources available as a result of the unjust killing of Miles Hall; and the powerful impacted families of José Luis, Miles Hall, Steven Taylor, and Pedie Pe-

The event ended with a Call to Action presented by Gigi Crowder and Bella Quinto Collins, sister of Angelo Ouinto. They introduced the campaign for independent coroners, gave an educational resource for folks to learn why this change is important, and distributed instructions for calling into Board of Supervisors meetings. Presented by NAMI Contra Costa, 40 Voices Campaign, African American Uplift Program, and Black Minds Matter 2! 9:30 am - 2:30 pm at Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church: 684 Juliga Woods Street, Richmond, CA 94804, serving lunch and hosting a raffle.

40 Voices were Heard! Our Journey to an African American Holistic Wellness and Resource Hub: Moving Toward the Promise and Recognizing Supervisor Federal Glover and Supervisor John Gioia for their Service and Continued Support for Equity. Also acknowledging Stanley Petey Cox - "Mistah F.A.B." for revolutionizing the way we talk about childhood trauma. County Leadership, Decision Makers, Clergy, and others motivated to improve the lives of African American residents in Contra Costa County attended.

This event was designed to report back on the progress made and the challenges discovered as the 40 Voices Campaign charges forward with an effort to establish an African American Holistic Wellness and Resource Hub in Contra Costa County. We shared the strategies we employed and the key voices that were lifted that joined our campaign as advocates to secure \$80,000 for a Feasibility Study, the creation of an African American Steering Committee, and 1 million dollar allocation for immediate services in Antioch to address the painful, racially motivated text messages from law enforce-

Ashley is a student at Saint Mary's College of California's Master's Program in Counseling, with a specialization in Marriage & Family Therapy (MFT)/ Professional Clinical Counseling (PCC) and long history of volunteering. Just a couple years ago, while contemplating a career change after receiving her BFA, Summa Cum Laude, in Graphic Design at Woodbury University, she began volunteering at NAMI CC, volunteering her design skills as a returning student. During her high school and early college years, she also volunteered with her local community college's LBGTQ+ club, her church to provide lodging for the unsheltered, and various other local nonprofits, including NAMI Ventura County in Southern California. In her free time, she watches educational videos, meets up with friends, practices design skills, and gets connected to her heritage culture through intentional language immersion experiences

Ashley's journey into the mental health space began at an early age. Her father, Phillip Lowe, PsyD and previous NAMI CC board of directors member, pursued his doctorate while Ashley was just a teen, and she showed great interest in the field and the communities he worked with. Years later, after having worked professionally in graphic design and as a motivational coach, she decided to "pick up where she left off" and pursue working in the mental health space. She remembered the impact that NAMI had on her and her community and requested to get started with volunteering through Shelly Ji, Volunteer Coordina-NAMI at

As a NAMI CC Volunteer, Ashley started with assisting Ashley Ciullo with newsletter format and editing and improved e-Newsletter functionality and accessibility. She later worked with the AAPI department as a bilingual Cantonese Chinese/English-speaking Peer Support Specialist through the CalHOPE Program. Most recently, Ashley took up the role of Webmaster at NAMI Contra Costa and led the complete redesign of the website, which has offered greater visibility and accessibility of NAMI CC's services and groups for visitors online. Overall, Ashley's work encompassed identifying gaps in access and creating high-level solutions for members and visitors, improving NAMI CC's exposure both online and offline.

NAMI CC and its genuine, caring staff has given her a safe, supportive, and educational environment to work and outreach to communities in need. As a peer, this is extremely valuable to continued recovery and utilizes the valuable peer experience in facilitating recovery for others. In the future, Ashley would like to leverage her continually improving language skills and lead a Cantonese Chinese support group.

FAMILY TO FAMILY EDUCATION COURSE



NAMI Family-to-Family is a free, 8 -session educational program for family, for significant others and friends of people living with mental illness. It is a designated evidence-based program. Family to Family Education Course is a free series of classes that cover the symptoms and treatment of major mental illness, as well as skills to help family members and friends communicate with, and advocate for, their loved one more effectively. Our new curriculum is presented once a week for eight weeks. NAMI Family-to-Family is taught by NAMI-trained family members who have been there, and includes presentations, discussion and interactive exercises.


Once your application is filled out, we can notify you when the upcoming trainings will start.
